

RAF Aviator

What is it?

An RAF (Royal Air Force) aviator is a highly skilled professional who operates aircraft as a pilot within the Royal Air Force. RAF aviators are responsible for flying a variety of aircraft, including fighter jets, transport planes, and helicopters, depending on their role and specialization. Qualifications/Experience Required:

To become an RAF aviator in the UK, you typically need at least five GCSEs at grade 4 (C) or above, including English and Maths, and two A-levels or equivalent qualifications. Additionally, candidates must pass a series of rigorous selection tests, including medical and fitness assessments. A university degree can be beneficial but is not always required. All RAF pilots undergo extensive training at the RAF College Cranwell.

What the Work Involves:

Piloting various types of RAF aircraft, depending on your role, such as fighter jets, helicopters, or transport planes. Participating in national defence missions, including air defence, reconnaissance, and search and rescue operations. Conducting humanitarian missions, including disaster relief and medical evacuation. Working as part of a team with ground crew, air traffic controllers, and other military personnel to ensure successful mission execution. Maintaining a high level of physical fitness.

The RAF offers a structured career path with opportunities for advancement to higher ranks and leadership roles. RAF aviators need to be physically fit, possess excellent hand-eye coordination, and have a strong aptitude for mathematics and technical subjects.

Money/Wage Guide:

RAF aviators receive a competitive salary, which varies depending on rank and experience. Starting salaries for newly commissioned officers (Pilot Officer) begin at around £27,000 per year. As you progress through the ranks, salaries can increase significantly, with experienced aviators earning between £45,000 and £70,000 annually.
