

## **Primary School Teacher**

### What is it?

A Primary School Teacher is responsible for educating children aged 4-11. They plan lessons, deliver teaching, assess student progress, and create a safe and supportive environment for learning. Primary teachers are responsible for teaching a broad range of subjects including English, Maths, Science, and sometimes even the arts, PE, and music.

### **Qualifications/Experience Required:**

To become a Primary School Teacher, you must have a degree (usually a BA or BSc) in Education or in a specific subject, such as English or Maths, followed by Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) or an undergraduate teacher training route like a BA Education with QTS (Qualified Teacher Status). You also need to have GCSEs (or equivalent) in English, Maths, and Science (at least grade 4/C).

#### What the Work Involves:

Preparing and delivering lessons in various subjects. Lessons are tailored to the age and ability of the students. Managing classroom activities and maintaining student engagement during lessons. Assessing Student Progress: Monitoring student progress and keeping records of their achievements. Giving feedback to students and helping them improve their skills.
